How to use a QR code

Open the camera on your phone.



Hold the camera over the QR code like you are going to take a photo of it.



A yellow box will come up on your screen.



Press the yellow box and it will take you to the website.

About our privacy notice



Before you answer our questions, you need to read our **privacy notice**.

It tells you how we will use and look after the information you tell us on the form.



The law says organisations must have a privacy notice.



It is up to you if you want to take part in the survey.

You do not have to take part if you do not want to.



If you take part, you do not have to answer all of the questions.

How we will use your information



We can only use the things you tell us if you agree. This is called **giving** consent.



We will use what people tell us to write a report.



If we write what you tell us in the report, we will not put things like your name or address in it.



That way nobody can tell it was you who told us.

How we look after your information



We will keep your information locked up safely on our computers.



We will only share your information with other organisations:

If the law says we need to share it



or

 To stop someone from getting hurt.



We will keep your information for up to 3 years. Then we will delete it.



Your rights

Your **rights** are things you are allowed to do and how you should be treated.



The law says you have rights when we keep information about you.
