## Having your say in person in York

We are the City of York Council. We want to make York a great place to live, work and visit.



We are looking at all of the places where people can go to **vote** in York.

**Vote** means having a say about how things are run.



York is split into different areas called **polling districts**.



People living in an area can only go to vote in person at a certain places.



A **polling station** is a building where people can go to vote in person.

This might be a room in a community centre or a school.



You should be told which polling station you can vote at.



This summer, the York area has changed a little bit. This means we need to make some changes to where people can go to vote.



Some people might have to vote in a different polling district or polling station.

### **About our survey**



We want to make sure that:

 People have a place to go and vote that works well for them

and



 Our polling stations are open and easy for everyone to use.



We are asking lots of people what they think about the places where they can vote.



We especially want to hear from disabled people. We want to know things like:



 How easy it is to get to the polling stations.



How easy it is to vote when you get there.



What support there is at the polling station.



What other support people need.



We have some questions for you to answer.



You need to send us your answers back by 31st January 2025.



## How you can send your answers back to us

There are lots of different ways you can send your answers back:

Open the camera on your phone.

A yellow box will come up on your screen.



Press the yellow box and it will take you to the website.

## **About our privacy notice**



Before you answer our questions, you need to read our **privacy notice**.

It tells you how we will use and look after the information you tell us on the form.



The law says organisations must have a privacy notice.



It is up to you if you want to take part in the survey.

You do not have to take part if you do not want to.



If you take part, you do not have to answer all of the questions.

## How we will use your information



We can only use the things you tell us if you agree. This is called **giving** consent.



We will use what people tell us to write a report.



If we write what you tell us in the report, we will not put things like your name or address in it.



That way nobody can tell it was you who told us.

# How we look after your information



We will keep your information locked up safely on our computers.



We will only share your information with other organisations:

If the law says we need to share it



or

 To stop someone from getting hurt.



We will keep your information for up to 3 years. Then we will delete it.



## **Your rights**

Your **rights** are things you are allowed to do and how you should be treated.



The law says you have rights when we keep information about you.

**Long term** means it lasts for 12 months or more.










**Question 11:** Are you a carer for someone?
