Policy CI1 Communications Infrastructure	Support –removal of existing infrastructure as outlined would be supported by the Drainage Boards who would draw attention to the fact that in several cases such infrastructure has been positioned immediately adjacent to and in certain cases, crossing watercourse to the detriment of flood risk management works. Comment – CI1 does not provide an indication as to circumstances whereby such development may not be permitted, but may be expanded or 'loosened' to provide a broader and more relevant context.
