This year, there will be no changes to your Christmas waste collections. They will fall on your normal collection day.

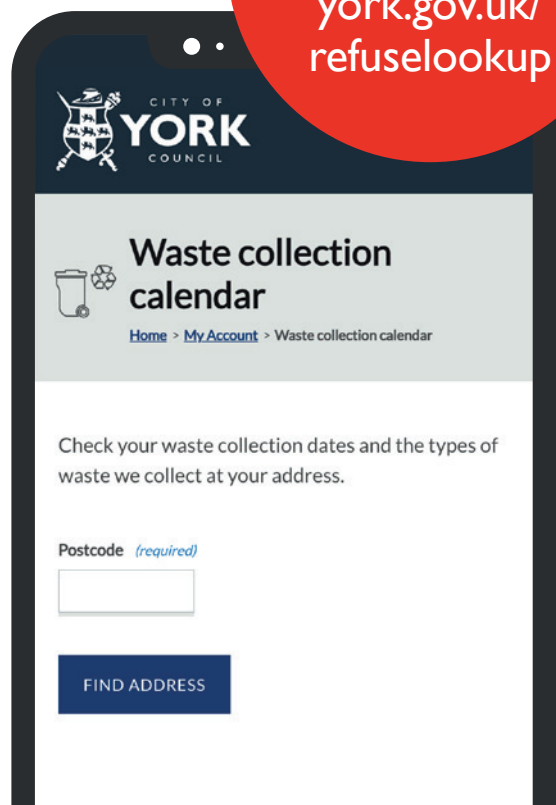

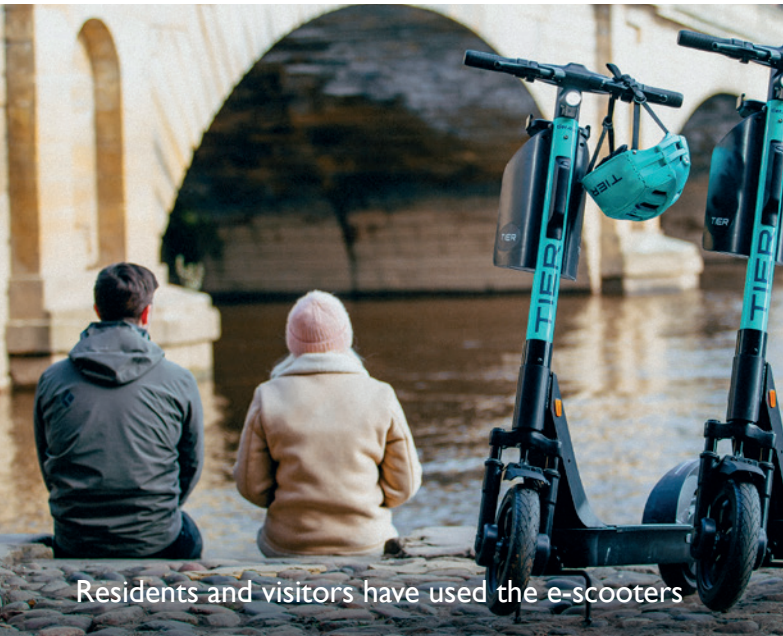
During November, we will reflect on the loss the city has experienced. Families and friends have lost loved ones and many people have found their lives disrupted beyond recognition.

News in brief: changes around the city

E-scooter trial

With 40,000 trips being made in the first 6 months of the trial, the Council has extended the popular e-scooter trial for a further 6 months, providing additional parking bays and routes across the city. The extension will enable more people in York to try out sustainable travel options as well as providing important research for central Government which will help shape transport legislation for years to come.

Housing Delivery

Lowfield Green, a community of 165 contemporary sustainable living homes in Acomb, has welcomed its first residents. Moving into one of the new bungalows Val said "being here is like a dream come true!". Lowfield Green forms an important part of the Housing Delivery Programme, which will develop 600 new homes across York in council-owned sites.

Library repairs

Major repairs to the roof of the main library in York city centre have been completed to conclude its transformation. Part of the roof had been repaired in 2014 as part of the York: Gateway to History transformation. Then the 'gold box' Archive pod was added to hold an internationally-recognised collection of unique documents, plans and photographs that tell the story of York's history.

Guildhall progress

Following significant investment by the Council, restoration and development of the Guildhall began in 2019. With major progress being made in the restoration works, August saw the University of York sign a 15-year lease. This will ensure the Guildhall is brought into the 21st century, whilst preserving and honouring its history, becoming a city centre hub for business, enterprise and events.

Community Stadium open

A new 100ft mural inspired by York and the life of the city has been unveiled at the LNER York Community Stadium. The mural, which took 100 hours to create, is located on the West Stand and shows famous York sites including the city walls, York Minster and Clifford's Tower.

In March 2021 the stadium hosted its first football and rugby league games. Since then thousands of fans have watched matches in the new stadium.

New centre of excellence keeps York at cutting edge of smart transport

The new site for ETAS Centre of Excellence for Embedded Software, on Hospital Fields Road, is the centrepiece of a £1.6m expansion of the Bosch subsidiary's long-established presence in York.

This expansion will bring a wide range of new highly skilled jobs to the area, with potentially 60-plus positions created over the coming months.

These experts in autonomous vehicle software will also generate a significant supply chain impact for automotive software.

This investment further cements York's place at the heart of SMART transport initiatives, which are reducing congestion and improving air quality in the city.

Businesses still being supported

Throughout the pandemic, business support grants, rates relief and loans have been administered quickly to more than 3,500 businesses by the Council's team. The support provided has saved around 300 businesses and protected the income of more than 500 households.

Now focussing on recovery efforts, and with the end of national support schemes approaching, the Council has pledged £500,000 to a business support voucher programme being launched this year.

This continues the Council's approach to supporting local businesses – the York Way. Eligible businesses will receive a voucher for up to £1000 to help them develop their products and services.

Thank you to everyone who took the time to comment on the proposals, we are now busy collating your feedback on both programmes, and they will go to the Executive for a decision in November.

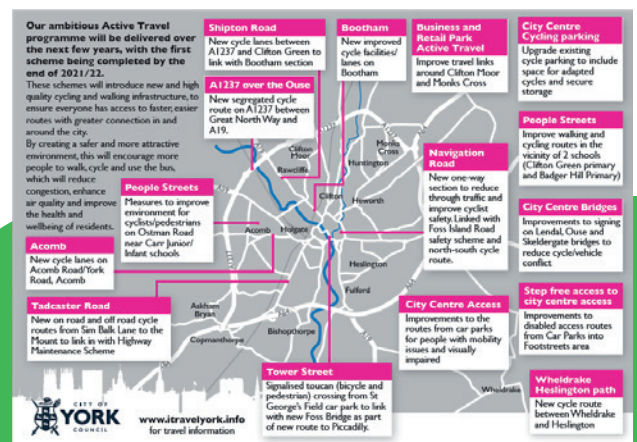
York Community Woodland secured for future generations

City of York Council has partnered with BetterPoints to give residents and commuters the opportunity to earn points and rewards every time they choose to get around the city sustainably.

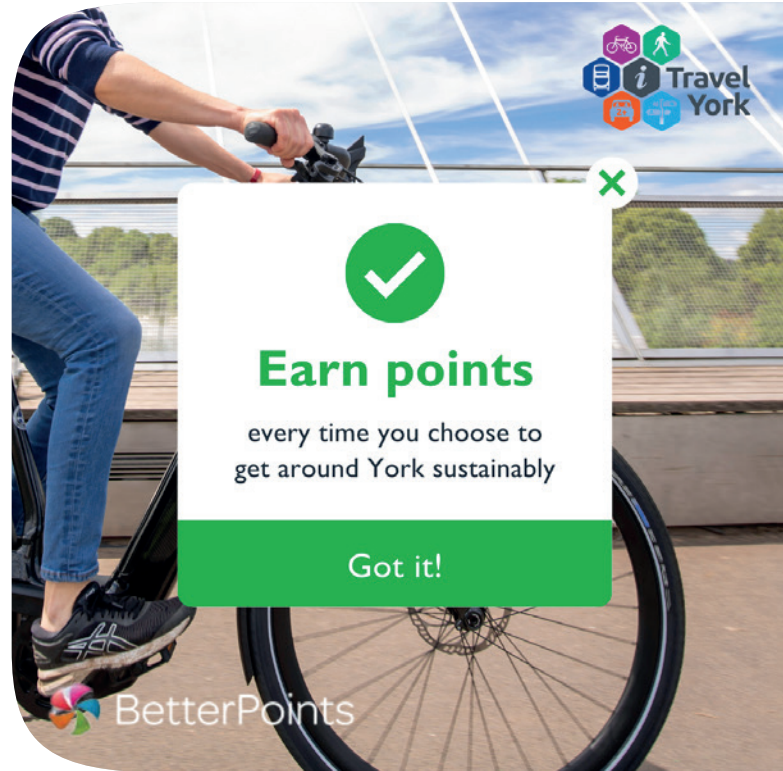

Music to live venues' ears as council supports recovery

City of York Council has reaffirmed its commitment to supporting York's thriving cultural sector by investing £100,000 from its Additional Restrictions Grant (ARG) from central Government.

At its March 2020 meeting, the Council's Executive recognised the importance of York's live music venues as an integral part of the city's cultural offer and agreed to a range of measures to support venues across the city. This includes a commitment to work closely with the York Music Venues Network to assist in supporting and developing this crucial part of the city's night-time economy.

This injection of funds will help venues to meet ongoing costs while there is a shortfall in income and help them reopen and reengage with audiences.

York welcomes Afghan refugees

Our city has been characteristically supportive of the arrival of refugee families. York has previously welcomed refugees from Kosovo and Syria.

From offers of clothing, toys and general household items to offering rooms and even houses, York has shown it is a city that welcomes those in need with open arms.

Boost your immunity this winter

This winter it's essential we protect ourselves and others against both flu and Covid-19. You can give Covid-19 and flu to your family and friends, without having symptoms.

Invitations are now being issued to people eligible for the free flu vaccine and Covid-19 booster jab. Please keep playing your part and get yours when offered.

Flu vaccination

Flu vaccination clinics are up and running at GP practices, the Askham Bar NHS Vaccination Centre and community pharmacies.

People are being invited by their GP surgery or may be invited to book their jab at the Askham Bar Vaccination Centre. Please wait for your invitation and get your jab when the time is right.

Covid-19 booster vaccinations

Booster jabs are currently invitation only and are being offered to groups in the same order as the first vaccines. You will be eligible if you are:

- living in residential care homes for older adults
- aged 50 years or over
- a frontline health and social care workers
- aged 16 to 49 years with underlying health conditions that put you at higher risk of severe Covid-19 (as set out in the green book), and adult carers
- an adult household contact of immunosuppressed individuals

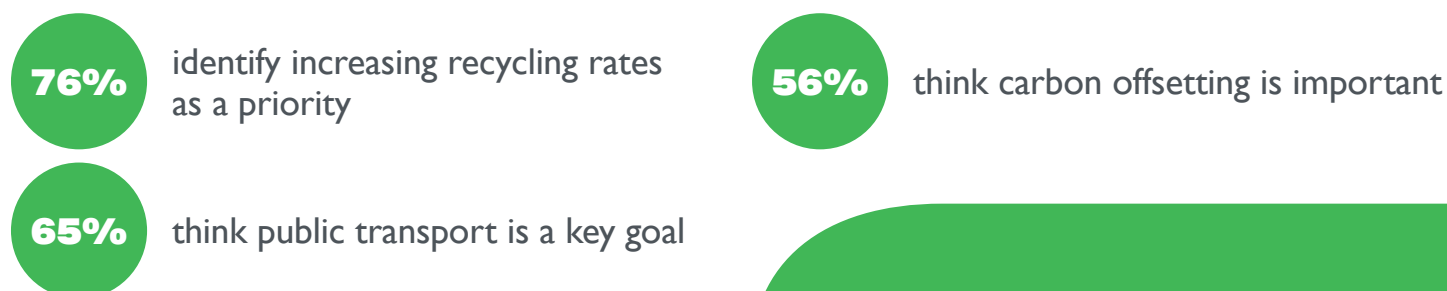

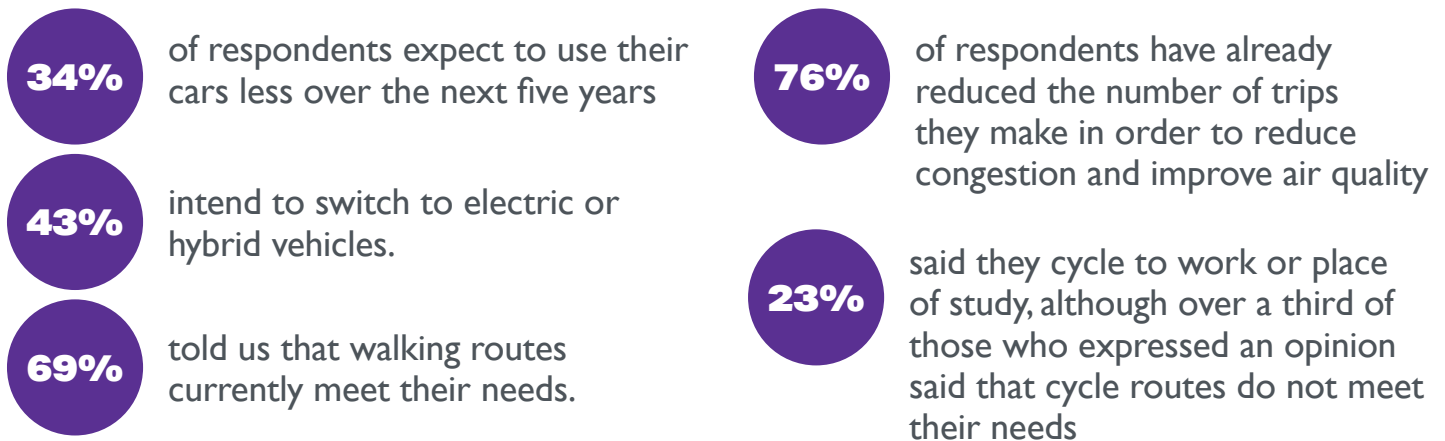

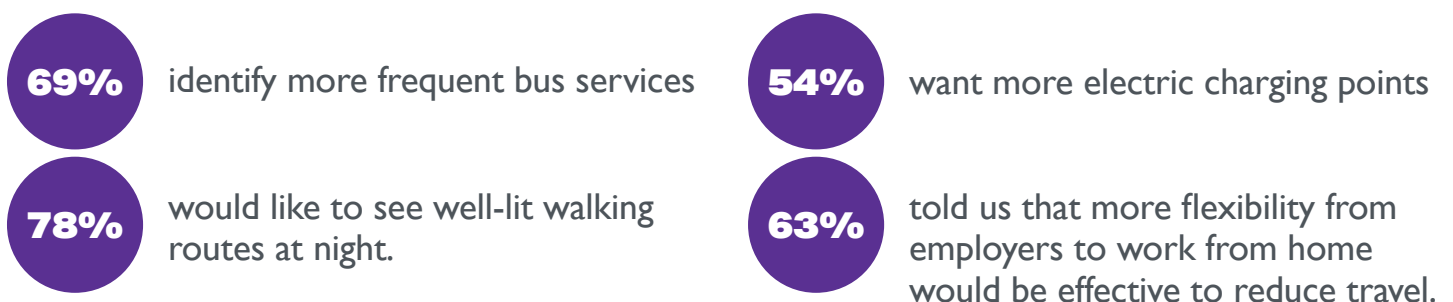

Through these hard times we are continuing to accelerate York's recovery to deliver value for money services.

Whilst we continue to provide support for those who need it most, successive years of Government funding cuts mean we are faced with a budget gap of over £10 million.

Our focus for the 2022/23 budget is to stabilise our financial position, allowing us to deliver services and support local communities. We will continue our £500m capital investment programme to accelerate economic recovery, whilst continuing to support local residents, businesses and communities.

To help us make these tough decisions, we want to hear what's important to you.

We want to find out how we can keep residents safe as we all learn to live with Covid-19.

The Council budget will be discussed and approved at a Full Council meeting in February 2022.

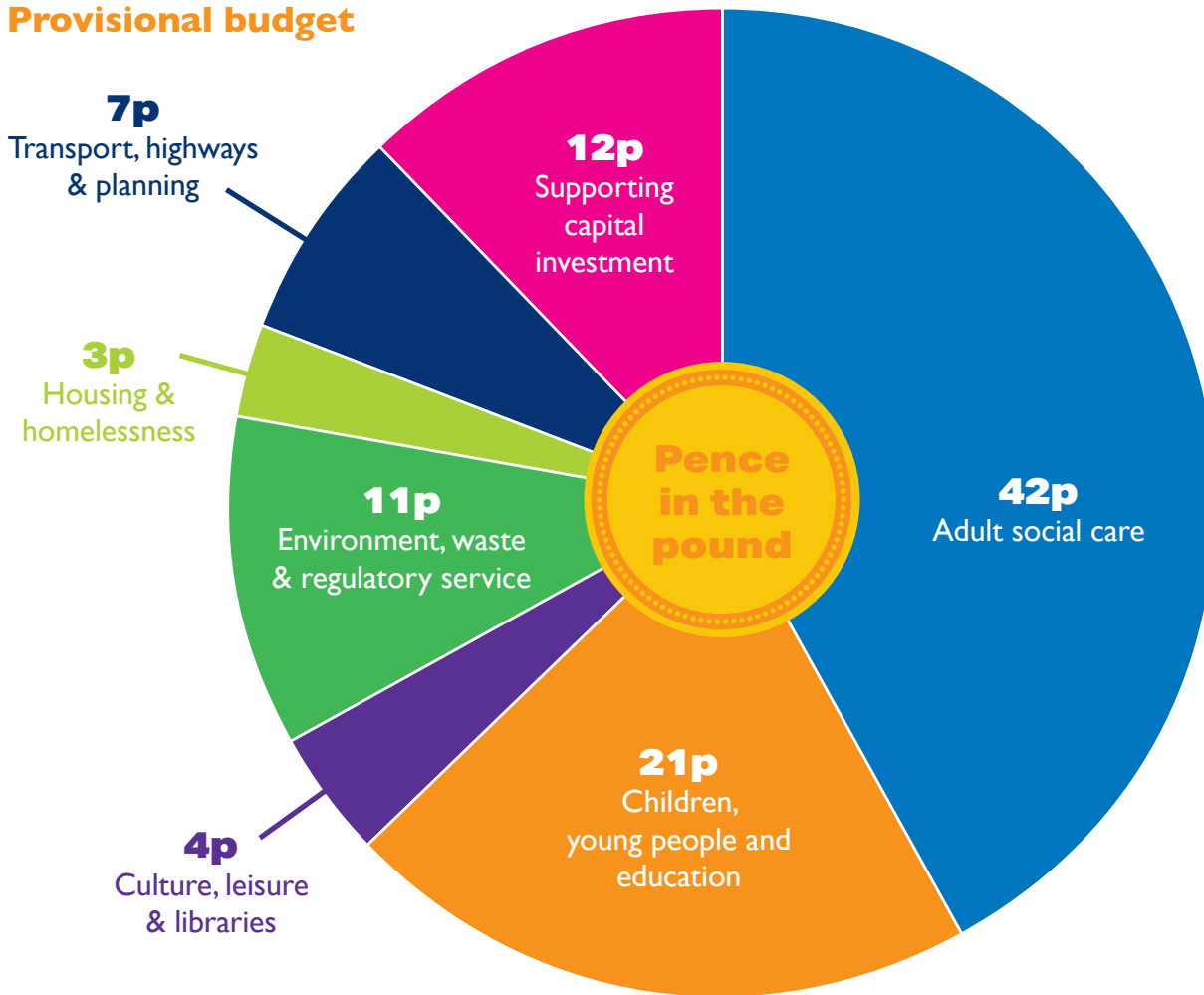

Provisional budget



Council tax charges are determined by our expected expenditure and our required savings for the current financial year (2022/23), through the Council budget.

York continues to have one of lowest council tax levels among local authorities in England, with the seventh lowest band D council tax for unitary authorities. As illustrated above, over 60% of the budget is spent on statutory services, which look after some of the most vulnerable in our city.
